We all know how very isolating life can be following the death of a child. Not only do we feel alone but sometimes friends choose to stay away from us, often for the best of reasons, but making us feel even more alienated. If we don't know of another family in a similar situation we can feel like this has only happened to us. When bereaved parents, siblings or grandparents make contact with us for the first time they often express relief that we do understand and they no longer feel alone.

At this time of year, as we approach Christmas, it can be difficult to join in the celebrations. Yes some of us will attend church services but we are likely to shed tears throughout, especially if this is our first Christmas after the death of our child. This is why our Candlelight Memorial Service is so important for us. We come together with others in our situation and immediately no longer feel alone. The service is devoted to the memory of our child, or children, publicly, with tears allowed. The readings chosen and presented so carefully by bereaved parents, the beautiful music and prayers of our service, all combine to provide us with an amount of healing which is precious.

I do urge you to attend the Candlelight Memorial Service if you can. This year we are pleased to hold it at Christ's Church Anglican Church. We haven't been able to use this venue for the last few years and so do appreciate being back there again. The environment is perfect and the stained glass windows add to the beauty of our TCF service. I hope to see you there.

Grieving your child this holiday season.

Here are some tips for coping with grief in the holiday season, take some, leave some, love some or hate some.

- 1. Acknowledge that the holidays will be different and they will be tough
- 2. Decide what traditions you want to keep and which ones you want to change
- 3. Create a new tradition in memory of your child
- 4. Make a conscious decision about where you want to spend the holidays; to keep it the same or to switch up the location
- 5. Plan ahead and communicate with the people you will spend the holidays with in advance to ensure everyone is in agreement about traditions and plans
- 6. Put out a memory stocking or box where you can write down memories you treasure. Pick a time to read them to honour your child
- 7. Light a candle in memory of your child
- 8. Include one your child's favourite dishes in your holiday meals
- 9. Make a donation to a charity that was important to your child in their name
- 10. Buy a gift your child would have liked and donate it to charity
- 11. See a counsellor. Maybe you have been putting it off, the holidays can be especially tough so this may be the time to talk to someone
- 12. Make a memorial ornament, wreathe or other decoration in honour of your child
- 13. Send a card to your child's friends that you may have regretted losing touch with
- 14. Visit your child's grave and leave a blanket, wreath or other meaningful item
- 15. Play your child's favourite music during the holidays
- 16. Journal when you are having an especially bad day
- 17. Skip holiday events if you are feeling overloaded
- 18. Don't get stuck somewhere, if you go to holiday events drive yourself so you can leave early if it gets too much
- 19. Practice self-care, do what ever helps you to recharge!
- 20. Leave an empty seat at the table for your child. If this is too depressing, invite someone over for the holidays that doesn't have family
- 21. Remember it is okay to be happy, this doesn't diminish how much you love and miss your child. Don't feel guilty for the joy you do find this Christmas.



Book Review Handling the Holidays


