As a young girl I had dreams of eventually having a large family. Unfortunately I could only have two children and although this realisation was a heartache, I accepted that fact and was grateful for the two I had. I was thinking recently of the many kinds of mothers there are and how we each are very different to our own mothers. My mother found it difficult to show love and my siblings and I didn't get hugs during our childhood. When we grew up we each started to give mum and dad hugs and they finally accepted and returned them. As children we would be sent out to play and as long as were home before dark we went where we liked. Things are so very different now.

The world is not such a safe place and parents have to keep a closer eye on their children's activities. I always remember the words of a friend who was a phycologist when he said "The best mother is the just good enough mother'. What I do know is that we do the best that we can. When the unthinkable happens and our child dies we suffer terribly with feelings of guilt and it takes us a long time to work through these feelings. It's natural to think that way but one thing I am sure of is that every parent who seeks the support of TCF does so because they truly loved their children and the grief is the cost of their love. What would our children want us to do? I know my son would not want me to give up on life. My life is busy, active and meaningful once again. I've found peace in my heart and mind. So "Live because they lived" and feel the love of your child around you when you think of them.

18 years anniversary

On 20 February 2020

Since the official launch of TCF Mandurah volunteers have provided a range of free grief support services to many families after the death of a child.

We started with a small office with carpet on the floor and a blind at the window. Our first items of furniture donated by Pinjarra Rotary Club were a large wooden desk, office chair and a steel cabinet which had held oil pumps.

An application to Lottery West produced our first computer and a Volunteer grant gave us our computer desk & chair and telephone.

Our launch on the above date was conducted by our WA Patron Graham Mabury and attended by TCFWA President Judy Mandurah MLA David Templeman, Mayor Keith Holmes and representatives from many community organisations, On that day we were offered a filing cabinet from Alcoa and a pidgeon hole cabinet from a government department.

From five volunteers then, we now have over twenty. We've provided training, held numerous displays, networked with other agencies and expanded our memorial events and services. With the help of a PEACH grant we furnished a larger office and now also have a "Quiet" room for one to one sessions.


