Welcome

Welcome to all who are reading this newsletter. A special welcome to those who are bereaved fathers, as we approach Fathers Day. Remember that the reason you are grieving is that you have loved and I believe that the love between a child (of any age) and parent never dies but lives on. I wish you peace and love. Those who receive this newsletter are in touch with TCF, however there are many bereaved families who are not aware of our services. The exciting news is that we have been successful in obtaining a grant from Lottery West " towards a 12 month outreach project to upskill, establish and grow peer led support groups for bereaved families". We are extremely grateful to Lottery West for this grant which will enable us to take our support services to rural areas of our huge state. You and I know that there will be many families who need our support and they don't all reside near Perth, Bunbury or Mandurah.

We've been fortunate to recruit Penny Madigan as our Rural Outreach Project Officer and she and I will be visiting as many country towns as we can, to hopefully recruit parents who are over two years in their own grief journey to be the local contacts. We will then go on to provide training, resources and back up to all regional contacts. It's vital for bereaved parents to be able to reach out to someone in their area. It's also vital to inform community groups of any kind, of our services. This is a huge project but will result in the provision of the grief support, that you and I have received, which can make a huge difference to peoples lives. I for one am immensely grateful that the bereaved parents of TCFWA were there to help me when I was devastated by the death of my son.

Our first objective is to visit Esperance and Kalgoorlie during the first week in September. In each place we'll hold a public interest meeting for the agencies who are likely to be in touch with bereaved families and any members of the community who are interested. This will be followed by a support group and we hope to recruit two or three volunteers to continue the work of TCF. If any of our members know of someone who resides in these or other country areas and who might be keen & suitable please speak to them and let us know. 
I'm not sure that I'm OK, Don't even think I'm fine, I'm empty on the inside, But not inside my mind.

When my child died, some people said I would just have to " accept it "

What does " accept it " mean?

Parents Answer

For me, when I was willing to risk being really close with my children and others again, I think I accepted it, and I still grieve.

I accept the fact of my sons death, but I cant accept any reasons why. I know he's gone and not coming back. I have grown emotionally and can live my life.

The intensity and frequency of my feelings has begun to change. I'm learning to adjust to this. I'm improving and I know it.

I am finding meaning in my life again, reinvesting, it's a reorganized way of being.

I feel alive again– more joyful and happy than sad and unhappy. For many bereaved parents , the word acceptance is too difficult. We know we can adjust, and we can learn to cope.

THOSE LEFT BEHIND

In the aftermath of the suicide of a family member or friend comes shock, denial, anger, depression, loneliness and profound sense of loss. The death is the more shocking when, as often, it is unforeseen - or when a severely damaged body is found or when identification

is necessary. Denial of the nature of death of young children or adolescents by parents, even on the finding of a suicide note, compounds an initial denial. Anger (Why did he . . . ?) with corrosive guilt (Why didn't I...?) focuses on the loss, and the loneliness is deepened

when baffled friends have difficulty or cannot extend consolation or support, a silence that is felt as the stigma that is attached to suicide. With terrible irony, just when a father and surviving siblings, (grieving in their own loneliness), need familial support, the loneliness of a mother is isolating or manifest as over-protectiveness of the siblings. Parents can feel shame, even blame, at their selfperceived failure as parents, and mothers are particularly prone to depression after the suicide of a child.

In contrast to the quiet gathering at a deathbed of one with chronic illness, is the death of an adolescent or young adult suffering from severe mental illness, with the final hopelessness of suffering is not always known to the other members of the family, but when it is, some families, already in turmoil with members emotionally drained, experience both loss and some relief.

Severe mental illness is one of the conditions that predispose young individuals to kill themselves. Depression is at the heart of most suicides. How can those left behind be helped? There are many ways: the support of family and friends, religious faith, the passage of time, psychotherapy and counselling.

An effective way has been through the establishment of local self-help support groups. These groups enable those who have experienced the suicide of a member of their family to get together and exchange support, information and encouragement to build a meaningful future.

From listening to others who have survived comes learning to survive and do better in life. The Compassionate Friends is one such group, indeed to provide this help is the mainspring and role for its existence and actions.


