Starting in New Zealand at 7 p.m. on Sunday 14 December candles are lit. As candles are lit in the different time zones we create a virtual 24 hours wave of light around the world. Hundreds of candlelighting events are held and many are in homes, as families gather in remembrance of children who died too soon but are forever loved and remembered.

My partner & I attended the Compassionate Friends retreat at Nanga Camp, a serene and beautiful setting nestled within the forest. The natural surroundings provided a peaceful and reflective atmosphere, perfect for connection, healing and remembrance. We stayed in the roundhouse, a warm and welcoming space that offered comfort and tranquility throughout our stay. The forest views and rustic charm added to the overall sense of calm and grounding.

The retreat was a deeply moving experience filled with shared moments of understanding, support, and compassion among attendees. We enjoyed wonderful meals shared together, fostering community and heartfelt conversation. Therapeutic sessions guided by a compassionate therapist included Sound Healing, Reiki, crystal energy work and intuitive readings. Each session encouraged personal reflection and emotional release, helping participants connect with themselves and others on a healing journey".

The retreat concluded with a beautiful and serene flower ceremony by the water—a heartfelt tribute to our children. As petals floated gently down the stream, the soft tones of Koshi chimes filled the air, har-

monizing with the sounds of nature. The gentle movement of flowers in the water, illuminated by soft light, created a moving and spiritual atmosphere—symbolizing love, remembrance and release.

The Compassionate Friends retreat at Nanga camp offered a space of peace, understanding and renewal. The combination of nature, sound, shared connection and heartfelt ritual made this experience truly healing and unforgettable.

COPING WITH CHRISTMAS

- Light a special candle to burn on Christmas Day in memory of your child or loved one.
- Make or buy a special decoration to hang on the tree in their memory.
- Some bereaved parents buy a small gift for the age their child would be and donate it to charity. Visiting the grave can help to remember the child.
- Plan your time so that you are under as little stress as possible. Plan your 'escape' if need be. Don't over-commit. Rehearse a simple explanation of why you may not attend a function.
- Share the memories with someone, by telling stories and looking at photographs.
- If you have young children in the family, be aware they might wish for Christmas to carry on as before. While this can be very painful for you, living through the normality of seasonal celebrations can be a comfort.
- New Year's Eve celebrations can also be difficult. Acknowledge your feelings to yourself and to those close to you and spend New Year's Eve with close, understanding family and friends who will allow you to be yourself and remember your child.

I have learnt

During this ongoing grief journey of mine I have learnt many things; these were things about myself as I gradually questioned and redefined all that made me and all that I knew about life. Redefining physically—the many physical sides to grief surprised me & how the reduction in our immune system leaves us so vulnerable to all kinds of conditions. Redefining emotionally & mentally—wow as with all bereaved parents this is almost impossible to describe. Sufficient to say that we process so much and finally learn how to be kind to ourselves and release our emotions in order to grieve in a healthy way. The final aspect, the spiritual one, was immensely difficult. My strong belief was severely tested and it took me a long time of questioning, searching and reading to eventually reach a new and stronger belief system.

We learn so much about grief. We know that the journey is never ending but we also finally find peace in our own way and I find solace in the knowledge that for me there will eventually come a time when we will be together again. I look back and recall bemoaning the fact that each day that passed was taking me further away from my son. Someone then said to me that in fact each day that passed was bringing me closer to him, that changed my outlook and now that so many years have passed I look forward to the future with hope and contentment.




